

Ecological Impact Assessment (EcIA)

Airports

We have developed a broad specialism in Airport work having undertaken the ecological and earth science impact assessments for the progressive expansion of Stansted Airport since 1979, including the second runway proposals, and of Terminal 5 at Heathrow. We also led the full assessment for the second runway at Manchester Airport, and smaller projects at Stansted, Gatwick, Glasgow, Luton, Jersey and Isle of Man Airports.

Restoration/Monitoring/ Implementation

Stoke Brook and the River Derwent

These ecologically diverse river systems within the Peak District National Park were devastated by an accidental spillage of thousands of tonnes of fine tailings material from a fluorspar mine in Derbyshire. With banks smothered and the riverbed gravels cemented by these sediments, the rich trout fishery and water vole population were under direct threat. Removing these sediments without causing further damage to the ecologically sensitive river and riparian habitats required our ecology team to work closely with engineers, contractors and stakeholders to devise a minimum impact approach. Using specially designed equipment, we have been able to restore these rivers to an improved state without impacting on their associated protected species and sensitive habitats.


