

The range of work that we cover at PAA includes:

- Reinstatement of damaged land around installations, e.g. calcareous grassland around a communications installation on the Sussex Downs;
- Mitigation measures, including habitat translocation, e.g. the creation of new flower-rich grasslands, scrub, hedges, woodlands and ponds in an award-winning scheme at Stansted Airport;
- Project enhancement to give distinction to a development scheme, e.g. the enhancement of roadside banks by introducing suitable wildflowers and management along the A55 in North Wales;
- Repair of eroded ground from fire damage, over-grazing, over-use or disturbance, e.g. various schemes in upland Britain including the Peak District and Cumbria;
- Pioneering large-scale work on restoring moorland vegetation, e.g. with Moors for the Future; and
- Specialist measures to accommodate protected species, e.g. badgers (access points, road crossings, new setts, etc.), encouraging bats (e.g. the creation of new bat caves), protection and rescuing great crested newts, creation of sand martin breeding cliffs, exclusion of grazing animals such as deer and rabbit.
